The Franklin County Office on Aging (FCOA) collaborates with the Central Ohio Area Agency on Aging (COAAA) to administer the **Caregiver Support Program.** The program can assist with a variety of free short-term services that include adult day services, caregiver counseling, durable medical equipment, health maintenance supplies and in-home respite.

We provide support to:

- Non-paid caregivers (18 years or older) of adults age 60 and older who have a demonstrated need for home care assistance.
- Non-paid parents or relatives 55 years or older caring for an adult child who has disabilities and a demonstrated need for home care assistance.
- Kinship caregivers 55 years and older who are caring full-time for a minor child(ren) and are not the biological parents

'Respite' Program or 'Senior Outreach' Program

<u>Serves</u>: Any senior 60 years of age or older.

<u>Program Details</u>: The Senior Outreach program's home visiting service is free to families who meet income guidelines.

Requirements: The Senior Visitor Service is available to clients in Miami, Montgomery, Preble and Shelby Counties. The Caregiver Relief Service is only available to residents in Montgomery County.

The ALS Association Central & Southern Ohio Chapter

For those living with ALS (amyotrophic lateral sclerosis) or PLS (primary lateral sclerosis)

<u>Serves</u>: Anyone diagnosed and living with ALS or PLS in a 55-county region (From Columbus, to NW Ohio, to Dayton, Cincinnati and SE Ohio)

<u>Program details</u>: Respite support through a **grant reimbursement program** that reimburses for costs not covered under insurance and specifically related to ALS or PLS. (Other programs for support are also available). <u>Requirements</u>: Persons must register with the Chapter, live in our 55-county region, and have an official diagnosis of ALS or PLS to qualify.
